

Level A1 (Beginner/False beginner) / A2 / B1

Language 24 hours

Discover basic structures for written and spoken language.

From listening comprehension to oral expression 9 hours

Students will develop their skills in listening comprehension (their listening strategies and how to go from general to detailed comprehension).

The tools which transpire in listening comprehension are then redeployed in oral expression activities.

This course offers continuous and interactive oral expression activities.

The choice of themes is determined by the communication goals of the language course.

Civilization 6 hours

The main objective is to help students in the everyday situations they find themselves confronted with and to heighten their awareness of what daily life is like in France.

Consolidating writing skills 6 hours

Students will write descriptions or short accounts and stories drawing on varied visual aids (such as drawings showing scenes from daily life, cartoons, photos, and comic strips).

Cinema 3 hours

An introduction to analyzing films and interpreting images.

Language laboratory 9 hours

Language laboratory work is based on two activities :

Level B2 / C1 / C2

Language 24 hours

Consolidate and build on structures for spoken and written language.

From listening comprehension to written expression 9 hours

Oral expression 6 hours

The aim of this course is to develop students' oral expression skills. It is not a conversation class but a course for developing students' linguistic and communicational aptitude.

Civilization 6 hours

This course draws on numerous authentic documents and field observations to equip students with the essential cultural baggage for apprehending French and French-speaking civilizations together with the concomitant vocabulary, as well as developing their intercultural skills.
